October's Speaker is Geraldine Powell

eraldine Powell of Signal Mountain, TN has been growing orchids for more than 30 years. She is co-owner of The Orchid Gallery, a small nursery in the Chattanooga area that is beginning to receive national recognition for its AOS award-winning plants.

She currently specializes in cool growing hybrids and species, especially Masdevallias, Draculas and Miltoniopsis, as well as some Pleurothallids.

She is the inventor of the trademarked Cool Pot, specially developed as a miniature evaporative cooler to help people in all climates succeed with orchids that like to be cool and damp, even on hot summer days. The title of the talk is: Succeeding With Cool Growing Orchids in Warm Climates.
