News Review of May 2016, Judge's Choice of the Evening



John Dunning's plant Ren Kalsom 'Red Dragon' was the Judges Choice of the Evening at Mays' meeting night.

Renanthera Kalmia is a primary hybrid between R. philippinensis and the larger R. storieri, both originating in the Philippean islands and producing very bright red long lasting flowers on branched inflorescences. I have maintained a couple of plants since 2010 in my hot (70 to 85 degrees F) basement plant room under bright light and only succeeded in getting blooms once before in over 5 years of trying.

I believe from my experience that there are 5 keys to maintaining healthy Renanthera.

1. First is temperature that never gets below 60 degrees F. Because of this precaution, do not take them outside in the summer.

2. Very bright light is needed, but not noonday sun, for about 12 hours per day. The plants are maintained in baskets without media, and I attach the plant stems to wires that hang about 3 feet down opposite corners of a suspended 150 watts yellow sodium lamp.

3. High humidity 70 to 80% relative humidity is necessary. I try to spray the entire plant, not just the roots, with water everyday, usually in the morning, except last Dec. and Jan. when I was recovering from surgery. I was rewarded for this by the appearance of a small spike at a leaf axil in Feb. which pushed out to form a branching in florescence this Spring. I do not claim the ;interruption of daily spraying brought about the bloom, but it could be factor.

4. Fertilization every fourth spraying with a weak 20:20:20 solution and then drenching the entire plant once a month by submerging in a large Home Depot bucket of water to wash off excess fertilizer.

5. Finally, it is the gentle air movement caused by a moving fan that keeps the dangling plants in motion all of the time. These vanda-like culture provisions require more of my attention than any of my other orchids.

AOS Student Judge, Florida North Central Judging Center

With show season starting just around the corner. I am sure we are all very excited to be planning our shows. As a new student judge it is always a pleasure to work with societies and their shows. I am always amazed at the level of support and enthusiasm of every society, and the hours of work in preparation by the clerks that join in the judging teams.

I know the judges really appreciate the volunteers taking the time to make sure we are well fed, as at some shows the judging can be a very long process, and for myself if I don't have something to eat my brain wants to shut down.

On that note, I personally have dietary restrictions as I am sure there are other judges that do as well, along with volunteers and vendors. I know there are many that do not eat pork specifically, some are diabetic, gluten intolerant and even vegetarian. How much thought, do you as a society make to have a broad range of options? I know many societies just take what they can get. Others have food catered in.

One suggestion is have your Judging chair ask the judges participating, if there are specific restrictions they need to be aware of. I am in no way suggesting that they chose specific menu items, but food allergies and specific restrictions (i.e.. things they cannot eat), should be considered.

You may try to have the membership stick to a specific menu or give them the restrictions and allow them to make dishes that would be appropriate. If catering in food, most caterers will know what menu items that they offer and will help you work with those restrictions. I fortunately am not diabetic yet and I love all the homemade sweets that are brought in. I have had some amazing desserts. But I have noticed that there does seem to be some consideration in the dessert items when there are nuts it is usually marked, sugar free and gluten free options. While I could personally make a meal just from the deserts I am sure that everyone would appreciate any effort to accommodate their individual needs.
