# Clark's Corner

Maryland's own Ladyslippers (Cypripediums)



'Tis the season for our own native orchids. Maryland hosts about 35 species of orchids, including 5 species of Ladyslippers, Cypripediums.

Featured is one of the easiest of the native species to grow in captivity. This is the Large Yellow Ladyslipper, Cypripedium pubescens. The species name "pubescens" refers to the fuzzy stems, which host the same kind of chemical found in poison ivy and one of the reasons deer are not fond of them.

Clark purchased three single single-growth plants from a perennial nursery when his family moved to Baltimore. They were planted in open woodsy shade under tulip poplars. They grow well with our native bloodroot, trilliums, and Solomon's Seal. The original three have multiplied to over sixty in the course of 30 years. They bloom very reliably every year.

# Maryland Native Plant Society

Native orchids - Ecologically interesting and deserving of MNPS support for their conservation

# April 25, 2017 - 7:30 PM Kensington Park Library, MD

**Speaker:** Dennis Whigham, Founding Director, North American Orchid Conservation Center, Smithsonian Environmental Research Center

Maryland has 50 native orchids, about 1/4th of the species occurring in the US and Canada. Our native orchids are represented by species that range from being completely mycoheterotrophic to evergreen species. They all have features in common that represent a challenge from a conservation perspective.

Native orchids cannot live without having appropriate mycorrhizal fungi in their environment at every stage in their life history. The ecology of native orchids will be the focus of this presentation, but it will be given in the context of how citizen scientists can join the Smithsonian and it's partners across the continent to assure the survival of native orchids.
