June's Speaker Nancy Mountford

Nancy Mountford, an MOS member and NCOS member, will be the final speaker (at our June 20 meeting) in our 2018-19 program year. Nancy has been growing orchids since 1970, when she was a student at Douglass College of Rutgers University. After graduation from Rutgers, she came to Maryland for graduate studies in Zoology, employment at University of Maryland's Chesapeake Biological Lab, and the founding of Cove Corporation which continues to specialize in the identification of marine invertebrates.

Nancy is an AOS-accredited judge, and has been active in showing and judging orchids at numerous shows, both domestic and international. She has been engaged in AOS leadership activities, having served as a Trustee and currently serves on their Audit, Finance, and Nominating Committees. Nancy is also a founder of Orchids Dominicana (Orchidom) which was launched in 1996 to produce top-quality orchids to meet the needs of commercial orchid growers and wholesalers in the United States, the Caribbean and Latin America.

Nancy will be speaking on Big-Lipped Phalaenopsis at our June 20, 2019 meeting, our last meeting prior to the MOS summer vacation.

Nancy will accept checks as well as cash for plants that were pre-ordered from Orchidom.

Phrag. caudatum 'Regal Bearing' AM/AOs

I have never won the Judges' Choice Award so I am pretty excited about that.

Phrag. caudatum is found in Mexico, Guatemala, Panama, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Venezuela. I got this plant in January 2019, at the MOS monthly auction. It was a division of David Smith's, who says 'Regal Bearing' is the clonal name given to this particular plant of this species. It grows well in bright morning light but it really gets east, south, and west exposures throughout the day in our sunroom. It is potted in a Paph mix with a little sphagnum thrown in for good measure. I try to repot it annually and when it is not in bloom, and water it thoroughly once a week at the sink. Our water has a high lime content so it is high in calcium. The plant seems to like this but just in case, mid-week I fill all of my Phrags. with about an inch of distilled water and let them sit in it. Humidity ranges from 45 to 80% during the summer, and I supplement this in the winter with a humidifier. I fertilize it with Osmocote 14-14-14 beads which also seem to keep it happy. This all seems to be working well but sometimes it's just dumb luck and guessing.

New Hardy Orchids for Maryland!

The United States is home to over 300 species of hardy orchids. Maryland hosts nearly 30 species. But the temperate world is home to thousands of hardy species. What about Bletilla, Calanthe, Dactylorhiza, or Platantheras? A few intrepid growers — and crazies like this author — are beginning to try them. Most of you are familiar with some of the Cypripediums and Bletillas.

I am trying a Dactylorhiza fuchsii acquired from Edelweiss Perennials in Canby, Oregon. This species, common in Europe, has done well in Connecticut, Canada, and Oregon. We'll see how it likes Maryland summers.

If you're interested in trying them yourself, choose genera and species that grow in similar climate zones to Maryland. Research their culture online, and look for seed or division grown plants. Imagine someday a yard full of these beauties.

MOS Group Perlite Buy

It has been about a year since I have brought Perlite to a MOS meeting for sale. I received several inquires at the Christmas meeting, so I will again coordinate a group purchase of Orchid Screen Perlite for MOS Members. I will repackage and provide in smaller size bags. Prices include transportation and handling and <u>deliveries will be</u> brought to the MOS Meetings.

The Perlite is sourced direct from the manufacturer Pennsylvania Perlite, and is offered in 4 cubic foot bags. They have a Standard Screen for Orchids which yields a particle size of 3/8" to 1/2". The pictures below are from a previous purchase. This falls between a Grade #3 and #4 and is a significantly larger particle size than you will find at garden centers or the big box stores. Usually this is ordered through orchid supply companies and would encurr additional shipping charges.
