president's message

The Orchid Shuffle

Like most people I am happy to have the end of April in sight. As orchid growers, especially ones without a greenhouse, we may have slightly different reasons, but good reasons none the less. Yes the spring flowers are wonderful. Seeing the daffodils and tulips brightening the gardens has to make one smile.

As the end of April finally arrives so do temperatures that will allow us to get our orchids outside and keep them out. Several weeks ago we had the temperature tease, a week where the nighttime temperature stayed above 50. I'm sure I'm not the only one who jumped on that opportunity. I needed to get the 30 some plants out of my kids' bedrooms and bathroom and to the sunny

warm outdoors. That was a bit premature, as I have been doing the orchid shuffle ever since and frankly I'm getting tired of it. Each morning as the temperature reaches 50ish I shuffle the plants outside and again at night shuffle them back in. This gets old very quickly, so I am very much looking forward to the end of April so I can stop doing the orchid shuffle.



There are a few things to keep in mind as you move your plants out. Do not put them directly on the ground. Slugs and snails will find them faster than you'd believe.

march 2012 judges' choice

Laelia jongheana

The plant selected by the show-table judges as the Judge's Choice for the March, 2012 meeting was *Laelia jongheana* 'Turnberry' AM/AOS. 'Turnberry' was awarded the Award of Merit at the MOS show in March 2010 with 83 points.

This plant was purchased from the Tropical Orchid Farm in January, 2005 for \$20. It is a seed-grown plant rather than tissue-cultured which means that the high quality of the flower was totally unknown at the time of purchase and only became known when it bloomed for the first time in 2009.

'Turnberry' is grown in a greenhouse under intermediate conditions, 55^o-60^o F night temperatures during the winter and a maximum summer daytime temperature of around 85-86^o F. The humidity is kept

high at around 50-70% with good air movement and bright light (actually, it gets some full sun during the winter because the greenhouse is not shaded at that time). Fertilization is mild at about ¼ to ½ tsp. per gallon of 20-20-20 chemical fertilizer about 3rd to 4th watering depending on the season, with the lower amount during the winter. It is growing in a 5 inch net pot hanging from the roof of the greenhouse and has proven to be a fairly easily grown plant which does not require any special conditions.

An Update from Headquarters – AOS on the move

The sale of the property to the Slomin Foundation, a foundation supporting those with Autism Spectrum Disorder, was completed on November 20, 2011. The AOS orchid collection was moved to temporary growing space in mid-December managed by a major donor to the Fairchild Tropical Gardens. Fairchild is now in the process of cataloging these plants and will in the next month or so begin their move and permanent installation within the Gardens. On Monday March 26, the furniture was moved from the old location to our new offices at the Fairchild and we will then begin the process of settling in. Due to the commuting distance, a number of AOS employees will not be going with us which will require us to manage the day-to-day business to the best of our abilities. During this interim transition, members may experience a delay with regard to requests of the staff and it is recommended that contact be through the general email address TheAOS@aos.org or through the appropriate committee email addresses. We will do our best to keep

They love to hang out under your pots, so hang plants if at all possible. Also check them regularly for other pests such as aphids and even scale and mealy bugs as they get airborne and find your orchids to be a tasty treat. Be aware of the sun. Never put your plant in direct sunlight right away, ease them into it and only for a little while. Orchid leaves can burn very easily and those burns never go away.

Even with the possible problems of putting your plants outside, it's well worth it. Every

year I see a big improvement once they are outside—better light and air movement really help. Temperature differential is a plus as well. So get those plants out soon and keep them there, they'll thank you for it.

Dr. Ruben Sauleda to Speak on Flasking and Propagation

Dr. Sauleda's Bio

Dr. Ruben P. Sauleda began growing orchids at the age of 12. At the age of 16, he established Ruben In Orchids. Almost half a century later, Ruben In Orchids is recognized internationally and is one of the oldest orchid business in the United States.

After graduating from Miami Senior High School, he attended Miami-Dade Junior College where he received an Associate of Arts. He was the first biology student in the first graduating class to receive a Bachelor of Science at Florida International University. He was then accepted to Florida Atlantic University where he received a Master of Science in biology

working on the orchids of the Bahama Islands. During this time, he was asked by Dr. Donovan S. Correll to collaborate on the Flora of the Bahamas by contributing the treatment of the orchids. After graduating from FAU, he was accepted to the University of South Florida, where he received his Ph.D. in Orchid Taxonomy. He has held positions as a Research Associate at Fairchild Tropical Gardens, Florida Atlantic University, the University of South Florida, and several other research institutions. He has taught classes at Florida International University and Miami-Dade Junior College.

Dr. Sauleda has written several books on orchid culture and has written over a hundred articles in scientific journals. He was Chairman of Education for the 2008 World Orchid Conference in Miami. His was responsible for arranging all the lectures, overseeing all the photography and was the editor of the proceedings. His specialty is flasking and is presently the leader in reproducing *Encyclia*, *Cattleya*, *Schomburgia*, and *Tolumnia* species and hybrids.
