The topic "Your First Orchid (What Now?)," will be covered by panel members John Dunning, Chip Hiebler and Chris Zajac. Each will speak about a specific topic and answer audience questions.

Chip Hiebler

Chip is a successful windowsill grower who recently added a sun room growing space to his home. He has actively grown orchids for 3 years and has won MOS Show Table Awards. Favorite orchids are epidendrums and miltonias. Chip serves as MOS Treasurer. He will talk about how a first orchid turns into a passion, about a hobby progressing over 3 years into a passion and how to inexpensively and effectively provide humidity for windowsill culture.

Chris Zajac

Chris transitioned into a skilled orchid grower through experimentation of indoor lighting and outdoor culture. He has been an avid orchid grower for 7 years and has won several MOS Show Table Awards. Chris serves as a Director on the MOS Board. He will discuss Indoor and Outdoor watering techniques, use of 1000 watt full spectrum bulb for indoor growing and the beauty of growing orchids in trees.

John Dunning

John knew nothing about orchid culture after retiring 8 years ago, but started learning by using books and the wise advice of several MOS members. He has kept alive some orchids for as long as 7 of his 8 years of growing them indoors, using his sun porch and 2 basement plant rooms. He will talk about outdoor survival and protecting plants from hot summer sun and pesky garden pests and adding spice to your growth media.

February judges' choice

Dendrobium aggregatum variety majus

I bought this plant from Waldor Orchids several years ago. At that time, it had approximately 20 mature canes, and was planted in sphagnum moss in a 5-inch plastic pot. Since I have not had much success growing in sphagnum moss, I transplanted it into a plastic basket using fast-draining bark mix.

This type of dendrobium is not easy to bloom. It requires bright light (similar to cattleyas), and daily watering and fertilizing during the growing season from April to October. I take it out of the greenhouse and keep it under 50% shade during summer. Once the temperature goes down in the fall it returns to the greenhouse, hung close to the roof, and watering and fertilizing ceases completely.

At about 55-degree winter temperatures, this plant initiates multiple flower spikes. This is when I groom the plant; I apply Neem oil to deter pests. Getting the flowers to open all at the same time is tricky (and out of my control). And the blooms only last for two or three weeks at most. Once in full bloom, though, it is a bright, cheerful sight to behold (Maria refers to it as the "happiness plant"). The sweet, honey-scented fragrance during the day just completes this beautiful package.
