Bob Travers will use the October meeting beginners' corner to show how to make a Picture label for virtually free provided you have a computer and color printer.

The MOS auction will be here before you know it. The Auction is the major source of revenue for the Maryland Orchid Society for the year and your QUALITY donations are key to its success.

Start now deciding which of your plants you are willing to donate. You have probably been repotting and dividing your plants and need to make room for new acquisitions.

Plants that perform well: Species plants, particularly rare ones, in bloom Phragmipediums, Paphiopedilums, Catasetinae, Habenaria, Blooming Cattleya alliance plants- small catts, brassocatts, mini catts.

Large specimen plants tend to be undervalued at our auction, particularly if not in bloom.

Clark's Corner

Singing the Orchid Blues

Looking at the monthly show table, we're treated to a veritable rainbow of colors. Remember the mnemonic ROY G BIV? We are definitely blessed with Reds, Oranges, Yellows, Greens, and Violets. But we usually come up wanting in the Blue-Indigo range. With the significant exception of some *Vandas, Thelymitras* and *Zygopetalums,* most orchid genera do not include true blues (sky blues and ocean blues).

The plant pigments responsible for orchid colors fall into 3 main groups: chlorophylls for your greens, flavonoids for your yellows, and anthocyanins for your pinks and lavenders. Ironically, "anthocyanin" comes from Greek for "flower-blue". Our usual rainbow comes from mixing these three groups. Orange and red orchids are typically of a yellow base with pink to lavender overlays. There are hundreds of chemical species within each major pigment group giving a great range of specific colors. The blue range of anthocyanins are simply missing from *Cattleya, Phalaenopsis, Oncidium,* and the ladyslippers.

You might be thinking, "But I've seen blue *Phalaenopsis* at Home Depot." Sadly, those are dyed plants. Using a patented technique, each stem of a good white *Phalaenopsis* is injected with a dye that infuses evenly through the developing buds. Blooming the following year in culture will give nice pure white flowers.

But, don't despair. As noted by our speaker and fellow MOS member Rob Griesbach, genetic engineers in Taiwan have managed to transplant the blue pigment gene from some true-blue non-orchids into *Phalaenopsis*, giving permanent blues. Rob also cautioned that it may be a LONG time before they are approved for release in the US.
