Orchids in the Wild Tours 2024

An orchid blooming in its native habitat is one of the miracles of the natural world that every orchid lover should see at least once. The OCA offers trips to see "Orchids in the Wild" in orchid-rich environments all over the world, including here in North America. Over the past 15+ years we have organized trips to Mexico (Chiapas), Brazil (Atlantic Rain Forest, Minas Gerias, Rio Negro, Serra Bonito, Bahia, Espirito Santo), Ecuador (multiple trips), Colombia (multiple trips), southern China (Guang Xi, Yunnan), western China (northern Yunnan, Sichuan), Thailand, Papua New Guinea, France, Sicily, Crete, Mainland Greece, Switzerland, Cape of South Africa, Madagascar (multiple trips) and the Ohio Valley (USA). These trips are a lot of fun, and you will come home with many wonderful orchid, scenery and cultural photos, and likely many new friends. The tour groups are small, and are often a mix of orchid experts and newbies. For some it is their first trip outside of the USA. For others, it is the first time they have ever seen an orchid growing in the wild. Our trips are also very educational: once you see how orchids grow in nature, you will be better able to provide the conditions that will make them thrive for you. After you have seen habitat destruction first hand, you will also appreciate how important it is to preserve the remaining primary forests. Orchids in the Wild tours take you to places you would never see otherwise. Our tours are led by experts on the orchids of the region who know where, and when to find the orchids. The tours vary in degree of physical difficulty, discussed in the description of each tour. We can also design small group custom tours, see Bespoke Orchid Tours.

Orchid New Year's Resolutions 2024



1. Repot! Some of our members (I'm thinking about you, Bob(s)) are really diligent about repotting. Fresh media, and sometimes a bigger or smaller pot, will do wonders for the health of your orchids' roots and by extension the whole plant. Repotting time is decision time on

whether to go for a specimen or fewer growths. Single growth clones don't lend themselves to specimen plants.

- 2. Update your lighting. If you grow indoors under fluorescent lights, it might be a good time to consider LED lights. An LED shop light at a big box or hardware store is not expensive and may even pay for itself in savings over a few years.
- 3. Clear out your deadwood. Most of your plants are vigorous and regular bloomers. But there's that one that just limps along. Throw it out! Unless it's a really rare clone, there are too many fine plants out there that will give you more satisfaction.

- 4. Try something new. Maybe a genus you've never grown before. I used to be terrible with *Bulbophyllums*, but then tried them again with advice from several members. Now they're regular bloomers and they make me happy.
- 5. Get involved in the Maryland Orchid Society. We have shows, both near and far, workshops, and auctions. Help is always appreciated and you will learn SO MUCH. Even cleaning up a little after the meetings and returning the tables to their proper places is greatly appreciated by the people who stay late to get the meeting room in order.

Preparing your Plants to Show

- First and foremost is to have your plants in tip-top condition. This applies to all show opportunities.
 - o Accurate legible Plant label (helpful if it can be pushed into the pot at show time) Plant Owners initials or name should be marked with Sharpie on the plant pot and not on paper labels when lent for away shows.
 - o Free of pests and evidence of past pest infestations
 - o Clean Leaves and remove dead inflorescences and leaves.
 - o Well Staked for show and or transportation. Staking begins as inflorescence grows. Do not change orientation to light as buds appear. Try to color coordinate staking and attachments to stakes with the color of the inflorescence growth. Colored floral tape helps with this. Butterfly clips are distracting and not encouraged.
 - o Pack for transport Plants should be recently watered and not dripping. If a plant is top-heavy place into a larger pot with gravel or a wet clay pot. Stabilize plant(s) in boxes with bunched paper. For transit you may need to protect the inflorescence and flowers by covering flowers with tissue paper, not plastic. Do not leave plants in a car parked in sunshine for hours. Owner's initials or name should also be marked with Sharpie on your boxes. Arrange plants within boxes to avoid transport damage.
- Considerations for lending plants
 - o Make an electronic list of the plants you are lending. Excel, Word, Email, whatever works for you. Identify the Owner of the plants. Measure flower size! Email the list to the Exhibit Leader

- as soon as possible. The Leader may start the plant registration before being at the show. It is easier to remove a plant than work in a new one at the show.
- o Check the spelling accuracy by a web search. You may need to recreate your plant label.
- o Where there is no ID indicate NOID what the plant is and color of flowers or description of foliage yes there are orchid foliage classes in exhibits. The Exhibit Leader will determine how to register and enter the plant.
- o Remember you are lending a plant to help build the best possible exhibit. Please only lend what has top qualities. The plant will be out of your environment for at least a week, and we need the inflorescences to be near peak as we build the exhibit. If your flowers at home are beginning to wane keep them at home these may be deemed unexhibitable.
- o Confirm with Exhibit Leader pick-up or delivery details.
- o If bringing your plants to the show for inclusion, please plan your travels to arrive at the show site by 9:00 AM. The later the plants arrive makes it extremely difficult to rearrange the exhibit for late inclusion.
- o Lending exhibitable plants for an away show exhibit will yield the Lender one MOS show table point, however it does not guarantee inclusion in the exhibit.

Each January MOS collaborates with the Rawlings Conservatory to put on an exhibition that combines our collections of blooming orchids with the Conservatory's extensive holdings. It's a marvelous kick-off to the spring show season and gives us a chance to shine in front of a small but enthusiastic local audience. MOS members have two ways to contribute:

1. Loan plants to the exhibit (a show table participation point is awarded to each member loaning one or more plants). We'll

2. Staff the exhibit. We get to answer questions, point out interesting aspects of our plants, chat with fellow orchid enthusiasts, and gently recruit new members for MOS (no heavy sales pressure required; folks tend to recruit themselves!).
